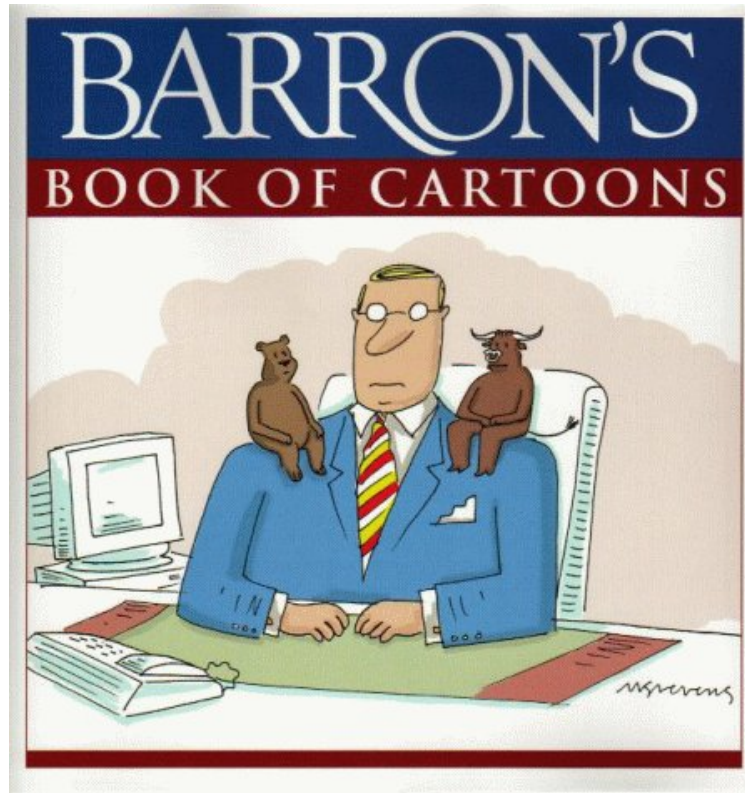

appeal to many readers. The humor is all in good taste with nothing suggestive, which I found commendable. I did not, however, find the majority of cartoons terribly funny. I did laugh out loud at some of them, such as an instruction at a board meeting: "Remember, you can fool some of the people all of the time. Those are the people we need to concentrate on," and "We feel advertising that insults the customers' intelligence distracts them from the high cost of the product." I also liked the line "Our stock has jumped six points on the rumor that you've resigned," and a man watching TV and observing "You know what golf needs? Fights." Those laughs made the book worth reading for me, but each person will have to decide if the cartoons represent his kind of humor..
