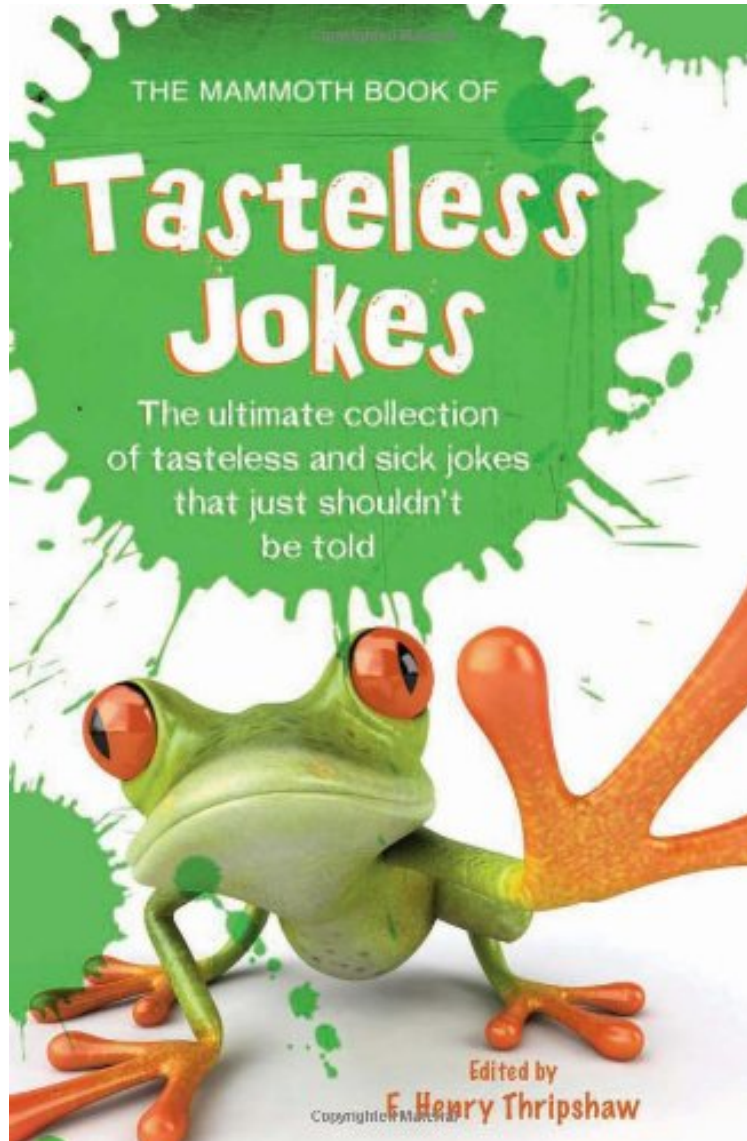

It's a fairly comprehensive collection, so readers are likely to have heard many of them before. And, as advertised, they are largely in poor taste. Topics include sex, crimes, sex crimes, lawyers, racial minorities, unpleasant body secretions, and so on. In the spirit of "fair use," here is a selection of the funnier, briefer jokes. - A man walks into a bar and asked the barmaid for a double entendre, so she gives him one. - Three women walk into a bar. "Congratulations," says the barman. "You've subverted a male-dominated joke format." - What do you do if a kitten spits at you? Turn the grill down. - My father is in a coma. First, this is a British publication, so there are some spelling differences from what Americans are accustomed to. And some of the humor depends on knowledge of British celebrities, sports teams, culture, and so on. The second thing is that there could have been better quality control when the original book was scanned. There are frequent systematic misspellings of the sort produced by scanning. If you like tasteless humor--and deep inside we all do just a little--it is worth giving this book a quick look. I don't recommend purchasing it or reading it all of the way through.
